

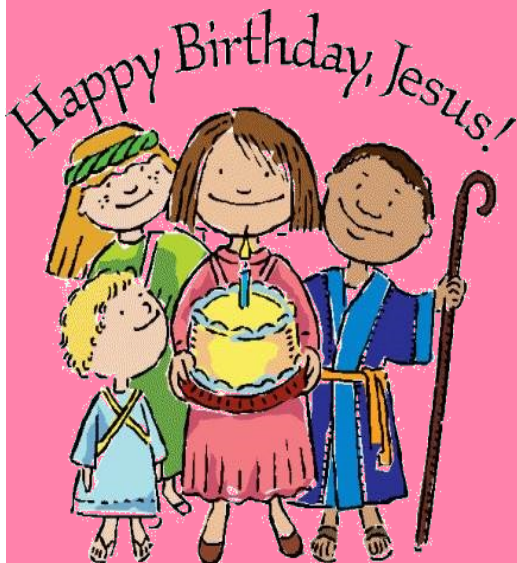

Time. Where does it go? December is upon us, and this is the season of Advent, meaning expectation and preparation. Next week is one of the most anticipated, as well as one of the most dreaded weeks of the year. Some students count the days until Christmas parties and a well-deserved break. Other students count the hours until the next final and a sigh of relief when the last test is submitted for the semester. Rest, nutrition and preparation enable a student to give his or her best effort on

tests, so please try to emphasize those with your middle and high school students next week.

Time. What does it mean? The weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas often mean time with family and friends, special events at church and school, colorful lights and decorations celebrating the majesty of winter, stars, and the manger scene. The manger scene represents the invitation which God offers to all who will hear His voice. Though He was the King of Kings, the Christ Child wasn't born in a palace, locked away from all but the royal family. Though He was Divine, He wasn't born in the Temple, guarded by the priests to exclusion of the laity. He was the Son of Man who was born in a place that was easily accessible to all, even to unclean shepherds who had heard word of His birth from the angel.

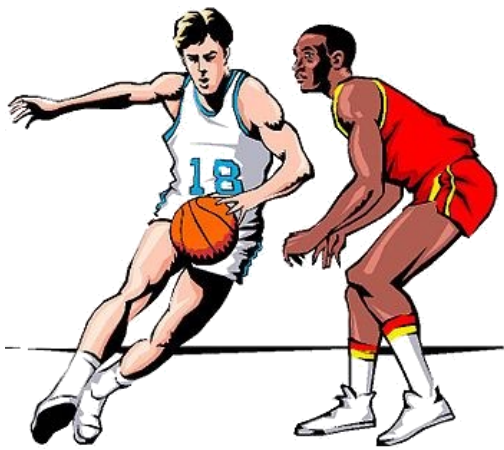
And the timing of His birth was perfect.

"When the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law that He might redeem those born under the law."

He was born in the *Pax Romana*, or the Roman peace, yet He demonstrates and provides peace in ways not possible through human efforts. Isaiah understood Him to be "wonderful, counselor mighty God, everlasting Father, *the Prince of Peace*."

My encouragement to you during this Christmas season is the same advice that I would give to students at this time of year: "Use your time wisely." Make time for friends and family; make time for rest and reflection; make time for wonder and worship – God chose the perfect moment in time to send His Son so "that whoever believes in Him will not perish, but have everlasting life." Such is the gift of Christmas – make time to open and appreciate what He has given!
