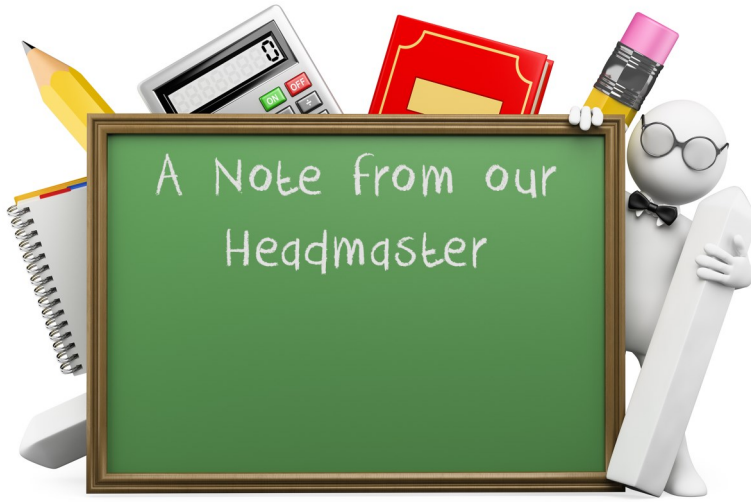

March Madness, The Big Dance, Cinderella Stories, National Champions, “One Shining Moment” – there are number of phrases that describe the intensity of college basketball at this time of the year. Players from all over the nation compete for the title, the recognition, the notoriety, the crown. Unless you are a basketball enthusiast, however, you probably don’t remember who won last year or the year before, so in some ways the title has as an expiration date.

The Apostle Paul writes with at least some knowledge of the competitive games of his day. In his first letter to the Corinthians, he says, “Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They do it to obtain a perishable wreath, but we, an imperishable one” (9:25, NIV). He uses this same image, in the same way when he writes to Timothy (2 Timothy 2:5), and this time he uses the word “crown.”

In the New Testament, crowns represent the reward for a life of faithfulness. Peter speaks of the crown of glory, James writes of the crown of life, and Paul, the crown of righteousness; crowns with no expiration date. And at this time of year, the crown of thorns that was pressed upon the Savior’s brow by those who cried for His crucifixion, also enters into the conversation. That crown was only one of the humiliations that Jesus endured before His crucifixion, and yet the Bible says that it was for the “joy that was set before Him endured the cross, *despising its shame*” (Hebrews 12:2). That joy emanated from the knowledge that people would experience regeneration and redemption through His death, burial, and resurrection.

People – redeemed, forgiven, renewed, reborn, and the last category of crown that Paul mentions in his letters. He refers to the members of the body of Christ in Philippi and Thessalonica as his “joy and crown.” The other crowns that Paul mentions would result from his resilience for the Gospel, remaining faithful during times of temptation and tribulation, maintaining his commitment in the midst of pressure from without and within. This last crown, though, represents how *the people* were growing in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, and allowing that knowledge to be seen in how they lived. Such a distinction describes the students at HCA, whether they are learning to write or leading the students in chapel, whether they are on an academic team or athletic team, whether they perform in science or on a stage, whether they enjoy reading or excel in math, whether they work an after-school job or are willing to go on a mission trip, whether they shoot an arrow or sing a song, whether they reach out to help another student or receive assistance from someone who sees their need – they are a “joy and crown” – that has no expiration date.

Meeting closed in prayer and adjourned.

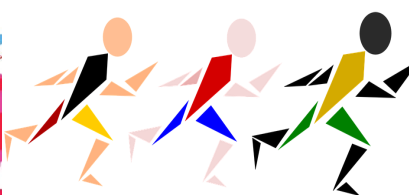

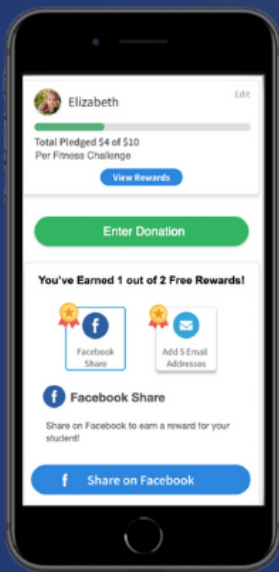
In addition, PTF will be awarding prizes throughout the 2 week period for participation. Stay tuned for more information on how you can win!
